Accredited Visiting Service

(Heather and Cheryl a visitor and client of our AVS service) We were a council chosen for this year's Age Concern's National Accredited Visiting Service Satisfaction Survey. Thank you to the visitors and clients who participated in this important feedback opportunity.

The results of this survey showed that both clients and visitors were benefitting greatly from the scheme. Notably, 88.9% of clients responded that they felt happier for receiving the service, in addition 87% of clients thought of their visitor as a friend. Two specifically noted that their visitors had become like a daughter to them. 80.6% of client respondents said that they could rely on their visitor to come regularly and 88.9% said that they were satisfied with the service overall. Many people pointed out that their client was from a different background or ethnic group than themselves and that it served to enhance their relationship through learning from one another. The survey showed that the visitors are very much appreciated by their clients and their client's family.

From the visitors we also had superb results. Particularly that 100% of respondents said that they enjoyed or greatly enjoyed their visitor role (the first time anyone has got 100% for any response!). continues on next page

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Many commented that they felt that they made an important difference in their clients' lives. There were also many glowing responses about the role that Margaret plays in co-ordinating the AVS such as "Margaret is fantastic. She will always listen and offer help at anytime" and "Margaret is only a phone call away."
